Topics for the FY 2015 Bishop B.A. Gibert Oratory Contest:

- 1. Should students be required to win college scholarships as a rite of passage? Why?
- 2. Which 3 of the 10 Godly Leadership Traits are the most important? Why?

The deadline for submitting an essay is January 20, 2015.

Contest Dates: (winners move on to next rounds)

1 st Round = January 23, 2015	7:00 PM
2 nd Round = January 24, 2015	12:00 PM
3 rd Round = February 14, 2015	12:00 PM

Contest Summary Requirements:

- 1. 2 page essay see above. Grades K-4th are to be 3-8 minutes long and Grades 5th-12th are to be 5-8 minutes long.
- 2. If a student advances to the championship round, their speech may be given a maximum of 4 times.

2015 Oratory Contest Rules

Students must formally register for one of 3 competing groups including K-4th, 5th-8th, and 9th-12th grades.

The contest will be held on January 23, January 24, and February 14, 2015 at Detroit World Outreach Church.

Contest Requirements:

Contestants are to complete registration (including \$15 fee), write a two (2) page essay and deliver up to four – minimum 5-minute speeches on the topic of

- 1. "Should students be required to win academic scholarships as a "rite of passage"- Why?
- 2. What are the top "3 Godly Leadership Traits" why?

Speeches must be typed in full and submitted by January 20, 2015 to: tlab@tlab-global.com

- Because the speech is to be an oration, appropriate gestures are allowed. Speeches for Grades 5th-12th are to be 5-8 minutes long and Grades K-4th are to be 3-8 minutes long. Speeches outside of the requirements will be penalized.
- When using facts and statistics, contestants should be sure to use the most current information available and may be penalized by judges for using inaccurate information.
- Criteria for judging speeches includes: Clarity, Energy, Passion, Examples and Enduring Truth.
- Speech content may not be significantly changed as a contestant advances, though finetuning for minor corrections, timing, etc. is allowed and encouraged.
- Memorization is not required and it is acceptable for contestants to use notes, or refer to their written speeches if necessary.

Prizes:

Winners in each major group will compete for \$ in cash. All students competing in the Oratory Contest will receive a gift for their accomplishments.



Contest Judging Criteria

Student speeches will be based on the following criteria:

Clarity

Was main purpose or premise of the speech understandable.?

Energy

Did the student deliver the speech with the appropriate level of enthusiasm at the appropriate time? Did it align with the purpose and premise of the speech?

Examples

Did the student provide examples that "made clear" main purposes and premises of the speech?

Emotion

Did the student make use of emotion that "made clear" purposes and premises of the speech?

Enduring Truth

Did the student provide fact (s) that are lasting truths and irrefutable.
